Prosecco (*Bin 1*)

Barocco, Veneto, Italy, NV, 11.0%

£9.50 £42.00

Well balanced with plenty of peachy fruit, a gentle mouth-feel and a delicate light finish. Perfect on its own or with fish and delicate starters. **Add Edinburgh Raspberry Gin Liqueur to crate a stunning Kir Royale - £10.50**

Pelorus (*Bin 2*)

Cloudy Bay, Marlborough, New Zealand, NV, 12.5%

£48.00

A sparkling offering from one of the most iconic producers in the world. Designed as an aperitif but has enough depth to stand up to many dishes. It has a bouquet of apple and lemon which complements fresh bready notes. The deliciously crisp palate displays toasty, creamy complexity, enhanced by a lingering nutty finish.

Britagne Brut (*Bin 3*)

Exton Park, Hampshire, United Kingdom, NV, 11.5%

£48.00

Planted across some 55 acres of Hampshire' South Downs, Exton Park Vineyard has become an award winning leading producer of English Sparkling wine. Its fresh attractive nose is generous, with a lemon character and note of passion fruit. A lovely minerality in the mouth indicates a good, balanced structure, with an intense backbone and very long finish with some white pepper notes

Champagne Brut (*Bin 4*)

Laurent-Perrier, Champagne, France, NV, 12.0%

£70.00

Pale gold in colour with a steady flow of fine and persistent bubbles. Delicate yet complex, fresh and well-balanced with hints of citrus and white fruits. The fruit progressively emerges to reveal a finely balanced champagne displaying great length on the finish

Cuvée Rosé Brut (*Bin 5*)

Laurent-Perrier, Champagne, France, NV, 12.0%

£95.00

Bright, salmon-pink in colour. Aroma: Precise and very crisp with a lasting impression of freshness, it has hints of soft red fruits, such as strawberries, redcurrants, raspberries and black cherries.

Moscato (*Bin 6*)

Innocent Bystander, Yarra Valley, Australia, 2018, 5.5%

125ml - £6.50 £35.00

If it was any fresher you'd slap it!' say the fun-minded folks at Innocent Bystander and we're very inclined to agree. To be drunk with light, chocolatey or fruit-based puds or just as a wicked, retro aperitif! Scott was converted during our visit to the vineyard in 2016.

White Wines

France

Mâcon-Villages (*Bin 10*)

Joseph Drouhin, Burgundy, 2016, 13.0%

£42.00

Made from Chardonnay grapes and aged in stainless steel for up to 8 months. The colour of the wine is bright, the nose is floral and fruity. Very straightforward and direct on the palate, as if biting into a grape. Fresh and light.

Chablis (*Bin 11*)

Domaine Du Colombier, Burgundy, 2015, 12.5%

£46.00

The Domaine du Colombier has been a family property since 1887, handed down over several generations. Exclusively planted with Chardonnay vines the wine produced is an elegant dry white with aromas of ripe fruit and a full body giving a classic finish.

Pouilly-Fumé (*Bin 12*)

Domaine Bonnard, Loire Valley, 2017, 13.0%

£44.00

A fantastic example of this popular varietal from a family owned vineyard in the heart of Sancerre. Fresh, dry white wine with classic Sauvignon Blanc characteristics of citrus and gooseberry flavours.

Pouilly-Fumé (*Bin 13*)

Patrice Silex, Loire Valley, 2014, 13.0%

£55.00

Domaine Moreux has been in the family since 1667 and through time and craftsmanship, the Moreux have developed an unparalleled understanding of their vines and terroir. A beautiful and elegant wine. Clean, fresh and beautifully displaying the appellation's signature gun flint notes.

Riesling Reserve (*Bin 14*)

Gustave Lorentz, Alsace, 2017, 12.5%

£40.00

The Gustave Lorentz Riesling Reserve has a pale yellow color, with an expressive and refined nose filled with citrus and white flower aromas. It has a lively attack, refreshing acidity, great structure and a clean, dry finish. A classic Alsace Riesling.

Chassagne-Montrachet 1er Cru (*Bin 15*)

Louis Latour, Burgandy, 2014, 13.5%

£80.00

Aged for 8 to 10 month in oak barrels, Chassagne-Montrachet unveils a pale gold colour. The nose is powerful and gourmet offering aromas of yellow peach, marzipan and brioche. The palate is generous and supple with well-integrated oaky hints.

Germany

Axel Pauly, Mosel, 2017, 11.0%

£42.00

Alex Pauly is one of the dynamic young stars of German wine. The nose has fresh hay aromas along with yellow and exotic fruits. The palate is fresh and medium-bodied, with a striking mineral character and clear tropical fruit notes before the long finish.

Austria

Gruner Veltliner (*Bin 17*)

Lenz Moser, Niederösterreich, 2017, 12.5%

£38.00

Gruner Veltliner, Austria's most widely cultivated varietal. It is a young light wine with a fresh and spicy nose. The palate is spicy with a fruity body featuring notes of mineral and pear.

Italy

Pinot Grigio Catarratto (*Bin 18*)

Botter, Emilia, 2017, 12.0%

£6.50 £26.00

Dry, soft & well balanced, this full bodied wine has an intense straw colour and long lasting fruity bouquet.

Gavi Di Gavi (*Bin 19*)

Rolona, Castellari Bergaglio, Gavi, 2016, 12.5%

£44.00

Admirable balance and easy drinking are Rolona's main personality traits. The bouquet is rich and long lingering, offering crisp, refreshing aromas of pear and green apple, dried hay, plus an intriguing hint of citrus and earthy mineral.

Spain

Moscatel/Chardonnay (*Bin 20*)

Goru El Blanco, Ego Bodegas, Jumilla, 2017, 13.5% **£28.00**

a Shiny golden yellow, ample ripe fruit aroma with typical floral notes of Moscatel grapes. Long, greasy in the mouth, leaves a pleasant white grape end of taste.

Portugal

Arinto/Verdelho (*Bin 21*)

Mar De Lisboa, Chocapalha, Lisboa, 2017, 13.0% **£7.00 £28.00**

A beautifully aromatic wine, with a fruit skin texture to go with the creamier pear and pink grapefruit character. The wine is very fresh, finishing with lemon zest acidity.

England

Pinot Blanc (*Bin 22*)

Stopham Estate, West Sussex, 2015, 11.5% **£44.00**

Stopham Estate's 2014 Pinot Blanc is a lovely pale lemon colour in the glass with fresh perfumes of pear. On the palate, pink grapefruit, melon and sweet fennel combine with a zippy acidity. Well balanced, the wine has a succulent sweetness which lasts well into the lengthy finish.

South Africa

Sauvignon Blanc (*Bin 23*)

Young Vines, DeWaal, Stellenbosch, 2017, 12.0% £7.00 £28.00

These wines are made from DeWaal's younger vineyards and are fruit-driven and approachable in style. Designed specifically to be easy drinking, this Sauvignon Blanc is a fruity, refreshing wine with fresh fig and gooseberry flavours.

Chardonnay (*Bin 24*)

Meerlust, Stellenbosch, South Africa, 2016, 13.0% £60.00

Complex, appealing nose with pear, citrus and floral notes developing into lemon cream, oatmeal and marzipan richness. On the palate the wine is medium bodied and linear but retains generous focused citrus fruit flavours with sleek, balanced and crisp acidity. The wine remains vivacious and fresh on the finish with clean citrus fruit and stony minerality. The wine has a long, very pleasant lingering finish.

Chenin Blanc (*Bin 25*)

Bush Vines, Mooiplaas, Stellenbosch, 2018, 13.5% £34.00

Most vines are trained along rows of wire but these grapes are from bush vines which are allowed to grow naturally. The result is a lovely straw colour, nose decidedly tropical with lychee / mango / and summer melon flavours, good weight and balance on the palate, lovely minerality.

SSV (*Bin 26*)

Lomond, Cape Agulhas, 2016, 13.0% £30.00

On the slopes of the Ben Lomond mountain in the Uilenkraal Valley, the vineyards are planted on as many as 18 different soil types, which appear naturally in small pockets along the slopes and produce intriguingly complex wines with flavour profiles that differ markedly from one block to the next.

A blend of Sauvignon/Semillion/Viognier. Brilliantly clear with a green edge, tropical aromas of gooseberry and passionfruit with floral and mineral hints. Crisp and fresh with a flinty finish.

Sauvignon Blanc (*Bin 27*)

Lomond, Cape Agulhas, 2017, 14.0% £28.00

The terroir, climate and location of Lomond all combine to create superb single-vineyard wines from individual vineyard blocks. Fresh and medium-bodied with a delicate minerality, while the green and tropical fruit flavours carry through onto the palate.

New Zealand

Sauvignon Blanc (*Bin 28*)

Franscesca Bay, Marlborough, 2017, 14.0%

£28.00

Produced by Sherwood Estate, the largest family owned wine maker in New Zealand, this is a great example of Sauvignon Blanc for which Marlborough has become renowned. Fresh crisp gooseberry and pear on the nose with a palate of granny smith apple and tropical fruits.

Sauvignon Blanc (*Bin 29*)

Cloudy Bay, Marlborough, 2017, 13.5%

£58.00

The cult classic from Marlborough and one of the first stops on Scott & Steph's New Zealand tour in 2011. A wine full of fresh herbal aromas and layers of ripe guava and tropical fruit. Gooseberries and passion fruit on the medium-full body; the palate is succulent and crisp with a long flavoursome finish.

Gewurztraminer (*Bin 30*)

Lawsons Dry Hills, Marlborough, 2015, 14.0%

£36.00

From the exceptional 2015 vintage and made in an off-dry style. This wine has lifted lychee and rose petal aromas, complemented by subtle spicy notes, the palate is wonderfully rich with great intensity and is finely balanced.

Australia

Semillon (*Bin 31*)

Mount Horrocks, "Watervale", Clare Valley, 2016, 13.5% **£45.00**

Mount Horrocks Semillon is from a low yielding, single vineyard of unirrigated vines in Watervale. This Semillon is light white gold in colour, the nose has perfumes of garden herbs and apple over lightly toasty, spiced oak. Citrus peel and green apple, baked pear and hazelnut praline, with a creamy texture and a long, elegant dry finish.

Riesling (*Bin 32*)

Inigo, Sevenhill, Clare Valley, 2014, 12.0%

£40.00

Steph's dubious navigation skills in the campervan led us by accident to the cellar door at Sevenhill. Characteristics of orange blossom, with punchy citrus flavours on the palate. The wine has some texture on the middle palate, which balances the zesty acidity. The finish is crisp and dry.

Riesling (*Bin 33*)

Polish Hill, Grosset, Clare Valley, 2017, 12.7%

£60.00

Jeffrey Grosset established his winery in 1981 in the historic township of Auburn, this iconic single site wine is what many consider to be the ultimate Clare Valley Riesling. 2017 is Grosset's third consecutive outstanding vintage. This makes 2017, 2016 and 2015 the best run of seasons they have ever experienced.

The late harvest has produced an extraordinary and very different 'Polish Hill'. An intense nose which combines mineral and tropical. The palate has a richness and freshness only found in great wine: notes of lime blossom, pineapple and wet slate. Youthful and multi-dimensional. A great 'Polish Hill' adding a touch of difference to the legend.

Chardonnay (*Bin 34*)

Tolpuddle, Coal River, Tasmania, 2014, 13.0%

£68.00

Scott & Steph's 2018 wine tour took us to Tasmania including a visit to Tolpuddle, the inaugural 'Tasmanian Vineyard of the Year' in the Coal River Valley. Cold, but dry and sunny, the site produces fine and precise Chardonnay with a backbone of firm acidity. An intensely aromatic nose that shows lemon peel, white blossom, wet stone and a captivating struck match note. Thrilling natural acidity courses through the palate with concentrated lemon barley, grapefruit and biscuit elements contributing weight to the body. There is intensity but also plenty of texture and verve, as well as a long finish.

USA

Dry Riesling (*Bin 35*)

Fox Run, Finger Lakes, New York, 2014, 11.5%

£46.00

Aromas of slate, lime peel and tree fruits identify this as a classic Finger Lakes Riesling. There's lots of flavor intensity here, with bold acidity.

Chardonnay (*Bin 36*)

Hayes Ranch, California, 2016, 13.5%

£32.00

Golden yellow in color, Hayes Ranch Chardonnay, invites you in with its vanilla and brown sugar aromatics. Hints of oak and cinnamon kissed green apple flavors help create a very smooth wine with a soft fruity finish.

Chile

Chardonnay (*Bin 37*)

Santa Ema, Maipo Valley, 2016, 12.5%

£7.00 £28.00

Vines are planted in the heart of the valley, very close to the Maipo River, where they are influenced by rocky soils and the winds that blow down from the Andes. A bright golden color and pleasant aromas of fresh fruits, ripe bananas and pineapples. In the mouth, it is a young wine, fruity, well balanced and with a refreshing finish.

Argentina

Torrontes (*Bin 37*)

Crios, Salta and Uco Valley, 2018, 14.0%

£36.00

Susan Balbo was first female winemaker in Argentina. She was a pioneer in Torrontés wines, transforming this traditional grape of Argentina into an emblematic one. Her first harvest broke the rules by creating a premium style of Torrontés distinguished by its elegant notes of white flowers, pear and ripe peach.

Rosado (*Bin 50*)

Borsao, Campo de Borja, 2016, 13.5%

£6.50 £26.00

Made from 100% Garnacha grapes this is a crisp dry rose with soft red fruit on the palate and balanced acidity.

USA

Zinfandel Rose (*Bin 51*)

Borrego Springs, California, NV, 10.5%

£26.00

Rich red berry fruits and a hint of sweetness dominate this light bodied wine. Easy drinking and perfect for a warm sunny day!

France

Chemin De Provence Rose (*Bin 52*)

Foncalieu, Coteaux d'Aix en Provence, 2018, 12.0%

£32.00

Chemin de Provence is a pale rosé by design. On the nose, red fruits like raspberries and strawberries, with more exotic fruits like guava in the background. The palate is fresh and clean, emphasizing ripe strawberries and perfectly balanced acidity.

Australia

Moscato (*Bin 6*)

Innocent Bystander, Yarra Valley, 2018, 5.5%

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Red Wines

France

Cabernet Sauvignon (*Bin 60*)

Domaine Galetis, Languedoc, 2015, 12.5%

£26.00

A real classic Cabernet Sauvignon. Full of blackcurrant jam on both the nose and palate with a touch of cedary oak adding some depth.

Saint-Emilion (Grand Cru) (*Bin 61*)

Croix Canon, Bordeaux, 2012, 14.0%

£70.00

An elegant, attractive blend of 75% Merlot and 25% Cabernet Franc. Exhibiting plenty of raspberry, blueberry and black cherry fruit as well as some crushed rock/chalky minerality and a floral note, this very impressive Canon is structured and precise.

Beaujolais-Villages (*Bin 62*)

Château de la Pierre, Beaujolais, 2016, 13.0%

£34.00

The vines – planted at an average altitude of 350 metres – are exclusively Gamay Noir. Aged on the lees in stainless steel vats to preserve the intense fruit character. You might taste ripe cherries and blueberries and a touch of pepper and mineral bite on the finish. A rounded, fruit-driven red that would match well with duck.

Pinot Noir (*Bin 63*)

Louis Latour, Coteaux du Verdon, 2015, 13.5%

£32.00

Domaine de Valmoissine 2015 is complex on the nose with aromas of undergrowth and raspberry. Ample in the mouth, notes of cassis, licorice and mocha are released. Smooth tannins and very nice freshness on the finish.

Châteauneuf-Du-Pape (*Bin 64*)

Vignoble Abeille-Fabre, Rhône, 2014, 14.5%

£54.00

Part of the famous Mont-Redon estate, Jean Abeille's vineyard occupies a total of 100 hectares. Superbly balanced between youthful fruit and warm, oaky complexity. Nose and palate are replete with notes of cinnamon and clove amid the the dense bramble fruit.

Côtes Du Rhône (*Bin 65*)

Parcelles 38, Rhône, 2015, 14.0%

£34.00

The Quiot family have been winemakers since 1748. A blend of Grenache, Syrah and Mourvedre, this is serious Côtes du Rhône, being full flavoured and having the structure to support the ample fruit.

Crozes-Hermitage (*Bin 66*)

Etiene Barret, Rhône, 2015, 12.5%

£44.00

This 100% Syrah wine from the Northern Rhône has a bright, peppery nose with hints of dark chocolate. On the palate, supple fruit flavours, lifted by an appetising black pepper crunch, weave around a delicate web of tannin and minerality.

Fleurie (*Bin 67*)

Lafayette, Beaujolais, 2016, 12.5%

£34.00

Gamay is a grape variety that is most famous for producing the light, fruit-driven red wines of Beaujolais. It is an extremely fruity wine of great delicacy with a silky texture that subtly overlies its full round structure. **This wine is served chilled. Light enough to accompany fish dishes.**

Fleurie (*Bin 68*)

Henry Fessy, Beaujolais, 2015, 13.5%

£42.00

Henry Fessy are one of the most significant producers of fine wines in the Beaujolais region and a leader in the regions current resurgence. This wine is served chilled. Light enough to accompany fish dishes. Lusciously soft and light, this wonderful example of Fleurie displays attractive raspberry fruit. The wine has a very pleasant bouquet of red fruits mixed with floral tones. In the mouth the red fruit is rich and concentrated, backed with a persistent finish.

Gevrey-Chambertin (*Bin 69*)

Louis Latour, Côte de Nuits, 2014, 13.5%

£84.00

Gevrey-Chambertin is one of the finest viticultural villages of the Côte de Nuits. Our Gevrey-Chambertin reveals aromas of lightly-wooded blackcurrant. On the palate blackcurrant and liquorice blend beautifully and are accompanied by a slight peppery finish, enhanced by silky tannins.

Italy

Sangiovese (*Bin 70*)

Botter Senso, Fossalta di Piave, 2017, 12.0% **£6.50 £26.00**

A delicious dry red, medium-bodied, with blueberry and plum flavours.

Barbera d'Asti (*Bin 71*)

Montebruna, Piedmont, 2015, 14.5% **£52.00**

Ruby red-violet. A striking aroma of ripe cherries and red berries. It is deep, full and harmonious in the mouth, with a long finish that maintains lasting taste and finishes with almond. The chewy palate offers juicy sour cherry, ground pepper and licorice alongside racy acidity and round tannins.

Amarone (*Bin 72*)

Villa Molino, Valpolicella, 2013, 15.0% **£58.00**

The name Valpolicella means "Valley of Many Cellars" because there are so many in the region which is situated North West of Verona. Bright red colour, subtly perfumed with pleasing aromas of bitter cherry and violet. The palate is soft and extremely fruity but it also has a serious side to it too. It has lovely texture to complement the fruit and a balancing acidity

Spain

Rioja Crianza (*Bin 73*)

Viña Amate, Rioja, 2015, 14.0% **£32.00**

After spending 12 months in oak barrel and another 12 months in bottle before release, this Rioja, made from Tempranillo and Garnacha grapes, has a powerful nose with layers of black and red fruits, leading to a fruit driven palate with mineral and gentle oaky notes on the finish.

Blend (*Bin 73*)

Finca Malaveina, Empordà, 2015, 15.0% **£50.00**

Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Garnatxa, Syrah and Cabernet Franc.

Despite its young age, Malaveïna has already gone from being a promising estate to a reality. This vineyard has already produced wines of great personality, such as the successful red which bears its name: the Perelada Finca Malaveïna. The palate is elegant, sweet, creamy and very structured. Well-polished tannins. Presence of fruit with balsamic and chocolates. Very balanced, persistent and long aftertaste.

Monstarell/Syrah/Cabernet (*Bin 75*)

Goru 38 Barrels, Ego Bodegas, Jumilla, 2013, 14.5% **£42.00**

A complex, mature and structured wine. A great blend of the ripe black fruit aromas with the toasted and smoked notes of the ageing. An intense but extremely elegant wine.

Portugal

Syrah (*Bin 76*)

Mar Da Palha, Lisboa, 2011, 14.0% **£7.00 £28.00**

50% Syrah, 30% Touriga Nacional, 20% Touriga Franca. A fabulous blend of the Syrah and the indigenous Touriga Nacional varietal. The Syrah providing weight, power and intensity of dark fruit and the Touriga Nacional providing elegance and finesse to the blend.

Touriga Nacional (*Bin 77*)

Ch by Chocapalha, Lisboa, 2012, 14.0% **£60.00**

100% Touriga Nacional, CH by Chocapalha is an homage to the Swiss origins of the Tavares da Silva family. Bold, dark fruit aromas on the nose with subtle nuances of leather and violet. The structured palate is supported by firm tannins and enticing flavors of black currant and raspberry followed by a remarkable finish.

Romania

Pinot Noir (*Bin 78*)

Cosmina, Cramele Recas, 2017, 12.5% **£26.00**

From the Banat region near Transylvania. Romanian wine is once again being exported after years of political problems. The palate is brimming with red berries and has a soft velvety finish

South Africa

Glass Bottle

Shiraz (*Bin 79*)

Young Vines, DeWaal, Stellenbosch, 2016, 13.0% £7.00 £26.00

A very drinkable medium bodied Shiraz. Rich black cherry fruit flavours on the middle palate with a smooth, round finish. White pepper and spicy flavours with molca undertones.

Cabernet Sauvignon (*Bin 80*)

Signal Rock, DeWaal, Stellenbosch, 2008, 14.5% £44.00

A beautiful Cabernet Sauvignon based blend with cassis, black fruit and raspberry flavours, with a long and lingering finish.

Rubicon (*Bin 81*)

Meerlust, Stellenbosch, 2013, 14.0% £60.00

The 2013 Rubicon classic expression of this iconic Cape wine. Very deep, youthful colour, and intense almost purple hue. The palate is full bodied, structured by beautifully sleek, ripe tannins which restrain the vibrant dark fruit typical of this vintage. The wine lingers on the palate with creamy fruit mouthfilling tannins.

Conebush Syrah (*Bin 82*)

Lomond, Cape Agulhas, 2014, 14.0% £52.00

Lomond Wine estate is located in Cape Agulhas in the most southerly tip of Africa. The grapes for this wine come from one of their best plots and are handpicked and hand sorted. It is a full bodied yet elegant wine with black and red fruit flavours, cherries, plums, spicy white pepper, a hint of cloves and oaky spice. Pair with rich meaty dishes.

Merlot (*Bin 83*)

Lomond, Cape Agulhas, 2016, 14.0% £30.00

A full-bodied wine with red berry and plum flavours enhanced by a trace of smokiness. A succulent palate of fruity sweetness and soft, round tannins balanced with oak spice, making this an easily-accessible wine.

SMV (*Bin 84*)

Lomond, Cape Agulhas, 2016, 14.5% £38.00

A Rhône-inspired blend consisting of 72% Shiraz, 12% Mourvèdre and 6% Viognier. Sweet, juicy red fruit, black pepper, clove with floral flavors on the nose. The palate is rich with intense flavors of pepper and spice, with soft, silky tannins.

New Zealand

Pinot Noir (*Bin 85*)

Sacred Hill, Marlborough, 2017, 13.5%

£32.00

The Tithing from Willunga 100 is made only in the best vintages, from small parcels of premium bush vine grapes. “Hundred” and “Tithing” are derived from the Anglo-Saxon terms for units of government within a community. Just as the Tithing was the select part of the Hundred, this wine represents the small selection of the finest old bush vine Grenache, that is hand-picked to ensure exceptional quality. This ‘old vine’ Grenache has concentrated dark cherry aromas with powerful savoury overtones. It has a long fruit-driven palate with ripe, persistent tannins.

Cabernet Sauvignon (*Bin 92*)

Quality without compromise is central to the Two Hands philosophy. Vinified in traditional open fermenters, the wine is then matured for 14 months in French oak hogsheads. A deep and lush ruby colour, with an alluring nose of rich fruit, and subtle touches of violet, smoke, and leafy herbs. Fulsome yet elegant, the tannins are smooth and the palate tightly structured.
